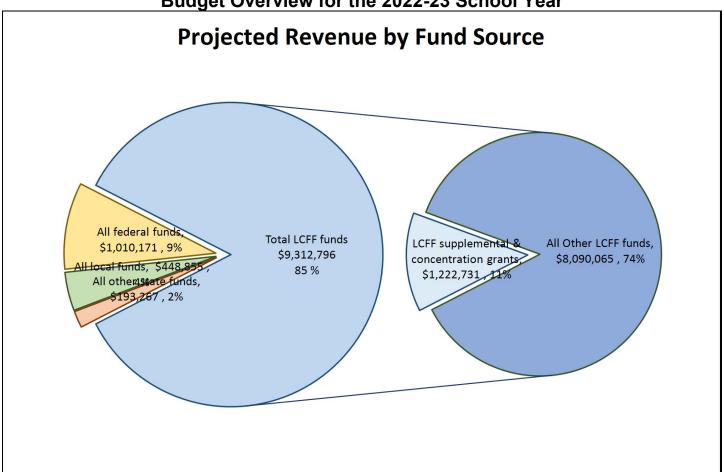

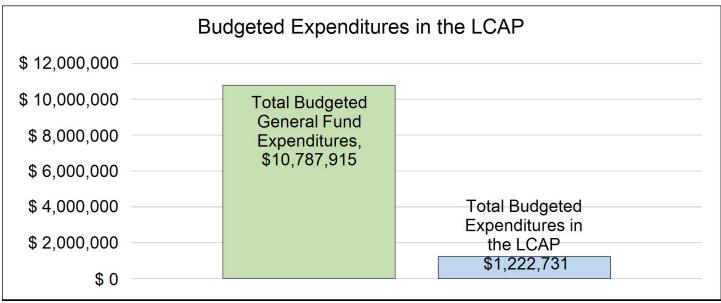
This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Rio Valley Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

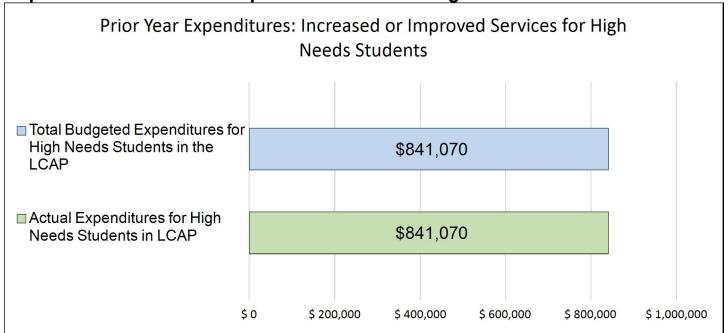
